The 3-year LLB course for graduates in other disciplines

If you already hold a degree in a discipline other than law you may complete the requirements of the LLB in three years of full-time study or equivalent.

The 4-year LLB courses

This degree is available to school leavers entering University in 2009. The program will allow students to concentrate on legal studies through their entire University experience, and is structured to ensure that there is cohesion and synergies between subjects in each of the first three years of the program. Students can complete their studies in 4 years, and with one of the course options can in their final year simultaneously complete the Practical Legal Training requirements necessary for admission to practice law.



The double degree LLB courses

Studies for the Bachelor of Laws degree (LLB) may be combined with studies leading to one of the following degrees: Bachelor of Arts (BA), Bachelor of Communication and Media Studies (BCM), Bachelor of Creative Arts (BCA), Bachelor of Journalism (BJ), Bachelor of Commerce (BCom), Bachelor of Computer Science (BCompSc), Bachelor of Science (BSc), Bachelor of Medical Science (BMedSc), Bachelor of Mathematics (BMath) or Bachelor of Engineering (BEng).

For the first year of the double degree courses, students enrol in subjects prescribed by the Faculty of Law. You will not be able to select subjects for the other course until second year.

The first year of the LLB must be completed full time, except where Faculty approval is given on equity grounds. In the following years of the degree, you enrol in law subjects and subjects in the other degree. Refer to the Faculty of Law website for course programs.



Workload

The workload in law subjects is demanding. In the early years, small group seminars are the primary vehicle for learning, and you are expected to participate in class on the basis of consistent reading and preparation. You should purchase the prescribed readings and be prepared for your class in the first week of session. Reading materials will be available from the UniCentre Bookshop about one week prior to the beginning of classes. Subject outlines for law subjects will be distributed at the Faculty of Law Welcome and Induction Session during Orientation Week. Information on Orientation Week will be included in your enrolment package which you will receive on enrolment day.

Am I going to study as a part-time or full-time student?

While there are considerable advantages in the full-time study of law, and you are required to spend the first year of your course as a full-time student, the Faculty recognises that at times it is not possible for students to study full-time. It welcomes part-time students. The number of subjects in which you enrol determines your full-time or part-time status. Any variations from the full-time first year program require approval by the Sub-Dean of Law.

Are there any compulsory subjects for the degree?

Yes, many subjects are compulsory, but a range of elective subjects are offered. Seminars
